Statement of Work

1.0 Project Overview

1.1 Background

The Department of Commerce (DoC) requires cellular telecommunication services to support cellular voice, data and other mobility-enabling communications at domestic and international locations in support of current and future operational requirements. DoC currently utilizes an assortment of contract vehicles to obtain these services and associated equipment such as cellular telephones, PDAs (Blackberry, Trio, etc.) and broadband access cards for laptop PCs. An informal estimate of DoC's current cellular service is 1500 cellphones, 600 PDAs, and 450 data cards. DoC will award a Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) to cover the above services and equipment needs. The BPA via calls/task orders will allow DoC Line and Staff offices to select from ALL service plans and equipment offered through a General Service Administration (GSA) schedule vendor to obtain an optimal combination of service coverage for users. The BPA will be extended to include all agencies within the DoC at the discretion of the awarding agencies Contracting Officer.

1.2 Geographic Scope of Contract:

The geographic scope for services required under this contract is worldwide. There are two (2) distinct components to the geographic access requirement - Domestic U.S. and International service. Domestic Service is defined as service to the 48 contiguous states, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Washington, DC, and U.S. Territories. International service is defined as service to all other parts of the world not covered under the definition of Domestic service. Combined service solution will serve both Domestic and International locations, or may include solutions for either Domestic and/or International service as stand-alone services.

The International service solutions must also include the following information:

- An alphabetical listing of countries served, grouped by geographic location (e.g., Western Europe, Eastern Europe, Central America, etc.)
- Identification of Partnership Agreements with overseas telecommunications carriers
- Cellular modulation and transmission technologies utilized for overseas connectivity, availability and cost of voice and data devices required, and information pertaining to interoperability with devices utilized for Domestic services
- Call connection charges, roaming charges, and other costs that are not otherwise provided under the details of standard voice and data plans.

1.3 Special Geographic Functionality:

Services will provide reliable, high-quality service coverage in areas that are geographically remote or otherwise isolated from commonly available cellular service. Service is desired in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area throughout the network of tunnels at the core of the Metro subway system. Information about specialized calling plans within geographic zones, such as state wide calling plans within Alaska, Hawaii, or other locations is desired.

1.4 General Service Criterion

NOAA has identified several desired administrative and technical features for cellular services under these contracts. These include:

- Maintaining or enhancing the geographic connectivity and service quality of cellular voice and data communications currently available to employees;
- Reducing communications expenses for individual cellular accounts through the incorporation of "pooled minutes" (when multiple users share a pool of minutes) for consolidated service accounts, provision of "within network" minutes, "home" airtime rates, and night/weekend service;
- Simplifying and streamlining administrative tasks associated with ordering services and devices, reviewing summary and detail reports of both usage and billing, and processing invoices for payment of services received;
- Minimizing the necessity for users to maintain multiple service accounts and associated cellular devices for domestic and international voice and data communication.
- And accommodating the transition of users and "porting" of existing telephone numbers.

1.5 Standard Feature Requirements

The standard feature requirements are functional business requirements based on discussions with representatives from NOAA line offices and review of recent wireless network system acquisitions by various NOAA components. The following features are desired as part of the standard plan offerings and/or available as enhancement services at additional costs.

2.0 Vendor Qualifications & Operational Services

2.1 Vendor Qualifications - The ability to provide the following:

- 2.1.1 Experience in designing, building and managing modern cellular telecommunications infrastructure and solutions.
- 2.1.2 Wireless communications system offerings, to include products for both the small/medium enterprise (SME) and large enterprise customer markets.
- 2.1.3 Experience in providing detailed billing information for each individual call associate to the Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA).
- 2.1.4 Wireless Communication Technology Refresh Plan - A wireless device must be in service for a minimum of 10 months to be eligible for an equipment upgrade at the discounted pricing regardless of the contract vehicle chosen. If one chooses to upgrade or replace equipment due to loss or theft of that device prior to completing 10 months of service, you may be charged full retail price.
- 2.1.5 All Seed Stock provision apply - a means to maintain equipment inventory on as needed basis. Refers to a limited number of defined devices that can be purchased and activated for emergency or short term notice deployment.
(Usually about 5 devices for agencies with 1k lines of service.)
- 2.1.6 Spot discounts for equipment and service plans

2.2 Operational Services

- 2.2.1 Administrative resources supporting service provisioning (new implementation and service transitions) and continuing service support for cost optimization, account consolidation, problem resolution and billing issues.
- 2.2.2 Technical support capabilities for network performance monitoring, maintenance and repair.
- 2.2.3 Repair or replacement of cellular devices that have malfunctioned or become obsolete. The availability of technical, maintenance and repair support facilities, including dispatch methods, response times and technician support tools.

3. ADDITIONAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following additional contract terms are hereby incorporated into the BPA between the Department of Commerce and T-Mobile USA, Inc.

- a. **Price Discounts:** Additional discounts from the contractor's GSA prices will be made available based on the overall volume of orders placed against this BPA. Ordering officials should contact the T-Mobile Government sales representative for additional information to determine applicable discounts being offered at the time of ordering.
- b. **Purchase of Open Market Items:** Only the Contractor's offered service plans are covered under its GSA contract and this BPA. All equipment and accessories are considered open market items. Ordering officials must ensure compliance with the requirements set forth in FAR 8.402(f) when ordering open market items under this BPA. Alternatively, open market items may be purchased outside this BPA using appropriate purchase card or other procedures.
- c. **Reporting Requirements:** The Contractor shall provide quarterly reports detailing orders placed against the BPA during the applicable quarter. Reports shall be submitted for each of the Government's fiscal year quarters and are due by the 15th day of the month following the end of each quarter. Reports shall contain the following information as a minimum:
 - List of subaccounts under the BPA master account
 - Breakdown of devices ordered
 - Total voice charges for the period
 - Total data charges for the period
 - Geographic breakdown of users
 - Minutes of use for the period
 - Direct-connect minutes of use for the period
 - Overage charge summary
 - Rate plan analyses - A rate plan analysis is an evaluation within an account (Delivery Orders under the BPA) of the optimal configuration of rate plans (i.e., number of voice minutes, shared or unshared) that should be used to keep costs to a minimum. A sampling of accounts throughout the Department of Commerce will be used for the analysis.

Pursuant to GSA Federal Supply Schedule Contract Number GS-35F-0503M and Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 8.405-3, Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs), the Contractor agrees to the following terms of a BPA exclusively with the U.S. Department of Commerce:

- (3) The Government estimates, but does not guarantee, that the volume of purchases through the term of this agreement will not exceed \$9,999,999.00.
- (4) This BPA does not obligate any funds.
- (5) This BPA expires on March 31, 2014 or at the end of the contract period, whichever is earlier.
- (6) The following offices are hereby authorized to place orders under this BPA:

- (7) Orders may be placed against this BPA via Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) or written BPA calls.
- (8) Unless otherwise agreed to, all deliveries under this BPA must be accompanied by delivery tickets or sales slips that contain the following information as a minimum:
- (a) Name of Contractor;
 - (b) Contract Number;
 - (c) BPA Number;
 - (d) Model Number or National Stock Number (NSN);
 - (e) BPA Call Number;
 - (f) Date of Purchase;
 - (g) Quantity, Unit Price, and Extension of Each Item (unit prices and extensions need not be shown when incompatible with the use of automated systems; provided, that the invoice is itemized to show the information); and
 - (h) Date of Shipment.
- (9) The requirements of a proper invoice are as specified in the Federal Supply Schedule contract. Invoices will be submitted to the address specified within the order transmission issued against this BPA.
- (10) The terms and conditions included in this BPA apply to all purchases made pursuant to it. In the event of an inconsistency between the provisions of this BPA and the Contractor's invoice, the provisions of this BPA will take precedence.
- (11) The Government is obligated only to the extent of authorized purchases actually made under this BPA.
- (12) A dollar limitation for each individual purchase under this BPA will be determined by each individual bureau/office of DOC.
- (13) For each Delivery Order (DO) awarded under this BPA, a separate invoice shall be submitted to the specified Invoicing Office. The Invoicing Office will be identified on the first page of the DO. These invoices need to be supported by your organization's internal ordering documentation associated with this DO.
- (14) Any duly authorized Contracting Officer may place orders under this BPA. Individual bureaus/offices of DOC may set a dollar limitation per order and the limitations shall be furnished to the supplier.
